We sold out of superb quality Isle of Wight garlic on the day it arrived so our apologies to those of you who were disappointed. We will order more in 2025. Almost all the spring bulbs were sold and the remaining few have been potted up to

sell in the Spring with the proceeds going to LHS Charities.

2025 STORE OPENING


We open on Sunday 2 February 2025 and will have:

- Wide selection of Gloves including Rigger and plastic/latex coated
- Mypex 2m and or 1m wide, cut to the length you want excellent for covering a newly dug allotment to suppress any weeds and warm the soil prior to planting.

It offers two adults a 50% discount off entry to any RHS Garden (except Flower Shows and Glow Illumination events).


If you would like to borrow the card, please speak to the cashier who will ask you to sign a borrower's form.
