
The Spring - Show

An early season growing update...

from our committee member Phil Smith.



At our home in Dorking, we're lucky enough to have our allotment 'on site'!

Two greenhouses and the unseasonably warm start to the year has enabled me to get ahead with sowing for early crops this year.

My wife saves toilet roll inners which are ideal for sowing early peas.



Here are Early Onward {R} and Climbing Yellow Mangetout {L} are hardening off in front of resplendent Euphorbias. (Note the extensive use of Environmesh in the background – a vital component of early and late season crops and pest control)

Tomatoes, Peppers and Aubergines (Czech Early) have germinated and are now growing on in the warmest greenhouse.

Leeks (Monstreux de Carentan) and Spinach (Clarinet F1) are almost ready for next stage, potting on. The leeks are supplied by Real Seeds www.realseeds.co.uk – my 'go to' small supplier of tasty and unusual Heritage



seeds based in Pembrokeshire. They supply a super beetroot called Sanguina! The Stores also has a good supply of seeds from DT Brown

I also grow 'Cello' (F1) Spinach, which I have found to be a super early variety.

Broad Beans (Bunyard's Exhibition and Aquadulce) are now hardening off.





By the 21st of February I was able to plant out both sets of peas. Note how the toilet roll inners permit the individual planting of each plant with no root disturbance and the cardboard will eventually biodegrade!



Based on last year, I will expect to have eaten our first crop of mangetout peas (which are yellow and grow as high as climbing beans) before the end of May, thanks to Environesh for keeping them cosy and warm in the cold weather when it comes!

I hope your gardening year is off to an equally exciting start.
