


For many more years than I have been

again protected from inclement weather by Enviromesh.

We've also had two or three harvests of fresh rhubarb already this season!

Happy Gardening to all ... In the last couple of months we've made great progress with securing the continued success of the Society.



> We want new members to join LHS so if you know of keen gardeners or allotment holders who aren't members, please tell them about us.


New products recently arrived:

Ultrafine Woven Insect Mesh 3m wide x 100m – the mesh size is 0.28mm x 0.79mm so white fly and carrot fly can't penetrate and it's ideal for protecting all your cabbages etc. Cost £3.80/metre.

Osmacote Exact 5gm tablets. Cost £1.80 for 25 tablets. These tablets release fertiliser over 5/6 months and are ideal for hanging baskets and pots – apply 1 tablet per litre of pot or basket. The Amazon price is over £5.00 for 25 tablets.




